

# Do You Know?

- The state recognized thirteen (13) schools as **Schools of Distinction** and one (1) school as **Honor School of Excellence**.
- Eighteen (18) schools have a performance composite above 80% and none below 78%.
   This places students in grades 3-8 performing in the top 20 school districts of a total of 115 in North Carolina.
- District-wide math proficiency remains above 90% for the third straight year. This places students in grades 3-8 performing in the top 10% school districts in North Carolina.
- Since science has been included in the ABCs results the district-wide proficiency has increased each year.
- The overall End-of-Course proficiency remained above 85% for the third straight year. This places high school students performing in the top 15 school districts in North Carolina.




